Brian and Patty Arensen serve in Nairobi in the Eastern Region office of Africa Inland Mission. Brian is the administrative officer overseeing 200 missionaries who serve in the two countries of Kenya and Tanzania. Patty is a co-leader for two Precepts Bible Study groups for women in her local church in Nairobi. She also is involved in the Kenya Ouilt Guild where she interacts with women from a number of unreached people groups. Their son Philip graduated from Arizona Christian University in May 2013 with a Bachelor's Degree in Biblical Studies. Their second son, Bruce, is a senior at MIT in Boston, studying Mechanical Engineering. Their daughter, Kerith, is in eighth grade in West Nairobi School. Brian, Patty and Kerith spent the 2013 summer months in the USA to visit family and supporting churches.

This privately-funded, non-profit organization was organized in 1990 in California and has affiliate offices in the Midwest, Southeast, Northwest, Missouri/ Kansas, Minnesota and the Dakotas. Mark Harrington, Executive Director, is an Ohio State University graduate and resident of Columbus. He has spoken at Peace Free Lutheran Church and plans to return with another presentation at some point in the future. The organization promotes prenatal justice through the publication of educational materials and delivery of lectures which establish the humanity of the unborn child, the inhumanity of abortion and the development of strategy and tactics to stop the killing. It conducts specialized training programs for clergy and lay leaders, professional associations, university students, crisis pregnancy centers and pro-life organizations.

Mission work is currently being done in India and in Russia. EECC sponsored two Bible camps for children, youth, young adults and families in Russia during the summer of 2013. These camps are organized and led by Russian pastors who Al has had the privilege of working with for several years. The other major work in Russia at present is sending funds for the distribution of Bibles through an organization called the Russian Church of

an organization called the Russian Church of Evangelical Christians, whose goal it is to take Bibles into every village in Russia that doesn't have God's Word.

"Al was in India during the spring of 2013 for a month of gospel meetings, pastors' seminars and speaking engagements at junior colleges and schools. St. Paul's School houses the AFLC-India office, a home for Pastor Luther, president of AFLC-India and a place for the girls' and boys' hostel. EECC has a sponsorship program for the students at the school to provide for the ongoing financial needs of the school. EECC also supports the Vivek Foundation, the medical ministry of Dr. Anand Kumar."

Foundation Dinners is presently serving 3 meals a day, every day, to homeless and needy people. We have been providing daytime shelter for homeless people for over a year now; no one else in Lancaster provides this service. In addition, a Social Worker is available to help people find employment, housing, education and job training as well as connect with social services and spiritual guidance. We are seeing a lot of new faces and believe the need is increasing. Foundation Dinners also supplies various food items for clients to take home and provides food supplies to more than 14 food pantries in and around Fairfield County.

We rely heavily on community donations as we do not receive any type of government subsidy. Acceptance of government funding restricts our ability to present the Gospel.

Kairos Prison Ministry

Kairos is an international organization in which volunteers meet for weekend sessions with approximately 35 to 40 prison inmates to study the Bible and learn about salvation through the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Kairos receives no state monies. Only donations and gifts help cover the costs of the weekend prison sessions including meals for the inmates and leaders and Bibles and crosses to those who complete the weekend course. John Pabst has led the involvement of Peace Free Lutheran Church with Kairos visitations at Hocking Correctional Facility and Ross Correctional Institution for the past several years.

For fifty years, Japanese missionary Reverend Kyuzo Miyaishi (otherwise known as "Frankie San") has been visiting and assisting inmates in the South Carolina Department of Corrections. Frankie San's mission commenced in 1963 when, as a student of Lutheran Southern Theological Seminary, he began preliminary visits to the state's most notorious penitentiary, Central Correctional Institution (CCI). Frankie was then employed at CCI as an educator and librarian for 28 years, where he took on the unique calling of institutional Santa Claus and Easter Bunny, annually disseminating goodies and snacks to the entire population of forlorn men. In 1994, when CCI closed, Frankie transitioned into the department's HIV/AIDS hospice program, assisting inmates with end-of-life care. Frankie was then forced to retire in 2001, and has been volunteering ever since. Today, with the help of his assistant, Chris Kirkpatrick, Frankie continues his mission amona inmates in the

Peniel, from Genesis 32:30. God and Jacob wrestled at ford Jabbok and God called Jacob, Israel, there. "And Jacob called the name of the place, Peniel; for I have seen God face to face, and my life is preserved." An independent ministry dependent on voluntary contributions, the school was established 42 years ago and was incorporated under the name Soldiers of the Cross. The Sortedahls founded the school on a 57 acre farm located 43 miles east of St. Paul, Minnesota. This past year, 17 children (mostly ages 14-16) were enrolled in the school, but enrollment has been as high 40. Students are expected to commit to staying at least one full year.

The school's income is limited to church and individual contributions along with student tuition when a family can afford it. No funds are received from United Way or other organizations. Peace Free Lutheran Church collects and sends "Box Tops for Education" found on General Mills products and "Labels for Education" found on Campbell soup cans to help in a small way. Peniel Christian School also receives monetary assistance from PFLC. The school's success stories are written in hundreds of saved lives.

The group is small, but over many years of being in small group studies I have observed that some of the most meaningful times have been when there are the fewest number of people.
